
I am writing this letter referencing our purchase and use of the galvanized Gaylord boxes at the Boone County School Warehouse. When we initially decided to build our 10,000 square foot warehouse we intended on using static shelving to store our surplus school materials but when we were shown the galvanized Gaylord boxes we opted to purchase them and have been extremely pleased with our purchase. These boxes have proven to be the exact solution needed to assist in our day to day operations and have resulted in a substantial monetary savings.

Having the boxes in the Warehouse we have discovered some real advantages of using galvanized Gaylord boxes versus static shelving. First and foremost is the ability of moving and repositioning inventory without the need of taking it off of one shelf and putting on another. Also because the boxes are easily stacked you can store items vertically limiting the amount of floor space used. The boxes can be moved without effort using a forklift or by using pallet jacks. Overall they are very useful in a warehouse setting.

The Boone County Schools Warehouse are very pleased with our purchase of the galvanized Gaylord Boxes and would suggest that anyone in the warehousing business should consider using them to help increase available floor space as well as lending a degree of mobility to your inventory.
